Pastor's Note

Today we celebrate the saints who have gone before us in the faith, they are a part of our Christian family. This feast day of All Saints is a celebration of our spiritual whakapapa. It is a good time to get to know the people who helped to spread the faith throughout the world. Learning about our spiritual heritage is a beautiful way of honouring God. We have a natural social drive within us to know how people are, a desire to get to know them, we have that in our day to day family life and in the friendships that we develop. God has made us as communal beings; we are made for community life. Today we celebrate the part of the community which has already finished the race, the members of the body of Christ who are already in Heaven.

The feast of All Saints provides an annual prompting for us to get to know some of the saints that have gone before us. In doing this we see the great and loving work of God in their lives, the great gifts that God gave them and the unique ways in which they were able to reach out to people, helping people to encounter God through their prayers and actions. As we get to know certain saints, we start to recognise some of the same gifts that God has given to us. In a way it is like getting to know a new friend, someone who we share similar interests with. Our faith teaches us that after our death our life does not end it just changes. Therefore, the desire to make new friends is still there, and the saints who have gone before us really desire to befriend and help us, yet they are not limited in their capacity to love like we are. They have no need to go to work, to do chores or to get enough sleep to function, they are always willing and able to help when we ask them to intercede for us. They want what God wants for us; they truly desire the best for us.

The Saints in Heaven, both the ones who have been raised to the Altar and those who are unknown to us but are part of our heavenly family, truly care about us and want what is best for us. They are united to God in such a profound way and God continues to use them to help us. We have this idea that it is normal to ask our family for help when we need a hand, and so, it is the same for our heavenly family too. We can go to them for help, we can ask them to intercede on our behalf and their help is very beneficial as they stand in the presence of God. They stand ready to help, as their life in Heaven is an extension of their charity filled life on earth. They stand in the light of God, in the light of pure charity, which they wish us to share in.
