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Reflection

Jesus was asleep in the midst of a violent squall. The disciples woke him to question whether he cared about what was happening. We too have found ourselves in the midst of powerful and dangerous storms, where we have no control over the strong, driving wind or the waves that are crashing around us. Where is the Lord in the midst of this storm? Do we assume he is absent from the situation if we do not hear him rebuking what terrifies us? Do we have faith to trust that God is the calm that we find when we enter into the quiet and stillness?

Pastoral Note for 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time.

The second reading for this Sunday is taken from St. Paul's second letter to the Corinthians and has quite an interesting turn of phrase, it states that "we do not judge anyone by the standards of the flesh." This is because Jesus has called us higher by virtue of his sacrifice for us. We have been called beyond the natural law of this world into the superabundant charity of the Kingdom of God. In this life there is an expectation of justice, an expectation that each person should get what is due to them. Therefore, each person should receive what is rightfully theirs, their wages for a day's work, their right to a good name, their right to fair and due process. We are called to see and treat people not just in justice but in charity, we are asked to see people through God's eyes rather than our own human vision of the world.

The difference between the way God sees things, and the way that we see things, is that God leads with mercy which is built on justice. When God relates with us, he does not just remain at the level of justice, (giving us what is our due) God gives us that which we do not deserve. God gives us even more that we could ever earn in this life, God continuously pours out his love for those who love him. None of us could ever earn the love and the great generosity that God extends to us. God wants us to be caught up in this relationship with him, seeing the world and its people through his eyes, becoming God's hands and feet for others.

We should not hold ourselves to the low expectations of this world, for we have been called to be Christ to others. God wants us to come to him in prayer, to receive the graces he has for us, so that we can share what we have received with others. One of the clearest examples of this is the forgiving love that God shows us. We are called to join in this aspect of divine charity, we are called to extend this forgiveness to the people around us, to our family and friends, work colleagues, acquaintances and even to strangers. We are called to enter into the divine life of charity, offering the gift of forgiveness as liberally as God offers it to us.

Jesus has made us a new creation, and as St. Paul tells us, "we do not judge anyone by the standards of the flesh." We have been made for much more than just seeing things through the eyes of the world. God has changed us and continues to conform our hearts to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, allowing us to be true witnesses to the divine charity that God wants to share with all humanity.
