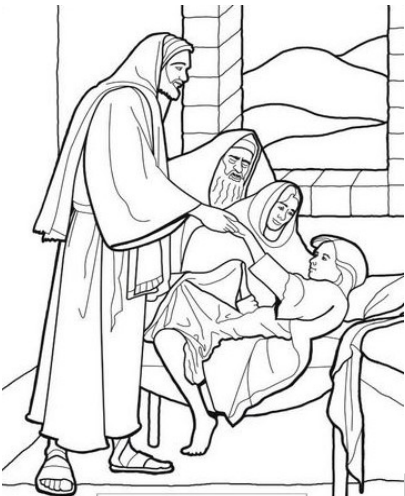

Reflection



What is amazing in this healing story is that Jesus drops everything to go to Jarius' house. Certainly, Jesus could have healed this girl from afar, but his presence, his gesture of compassion, reveals God's grace of healing. Ask yourself, Am I aware of Christ's healing presence? Then consider ways in which your presence might aid the healing of others.

Extract taken from Daily Prayer 2021

Pastoral Note for 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Today's first reading tells us about God's Divine Will to give life and health to all He has created. And today's Gospel reminds us that Jesus was sent to bring healing and life into a world of sin, suffering and death. "Death was not God's doing, he takes no pleasure in the extinction of the living. To be – for this he created all; the world's created things have health in them."

Jesus Our Divine Physician was sent to heal us physically and spiritually. During his earthly life, Jesus was very active in healing bodies and souls. He cured the blind, opened the ears of the deaf, cured the woman with the haemorrhage and brought the dead back to life. The Lord came as the heavenly physician and even declared this Himself... "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. I came not to call the righteous, but sinners." Again, Jesus said to them, "Surely you will quote this proverb to me: 'Physician, heal yourself!' And you will tell me, 'Do here in your hometown what we have heard that you did in Capernaum.'"

Jesus used the image of a physician (doctor) as an expression of His desire to heal both the body and soul of those who followed Him.

The early Church Fathers gave our Lord the title of "the Divine Physician." Bishop Ignatius of Antioch, who died a martyr in Rome, first used the term Divine Physician...he said very beautifully, "There is one Physician who is... God existing in the flesh...Jesus Christ our Lord."

With confidence we can turn to Our Lord the Divine Physician for all our needs but let us pray especially for our loved ones in this time of dramatic illness with the COVID-19 virus.

PRAYER AGAINST CORONAVIRUS TO OUR LORD THE DIVINE PHYSICIAN.

Lord Jesus Christ, our Divine physician, we ask you to guard and protect us from COVID-19 and all serious illness. For all that have died from it, have mercy; For those that are ill now, bring healing. For those searching for a remedy, enlighten them; For medical caregivers helping the sick, strengthen and shield them. For those working to contain the spread, grant them success; For the afraid, grant peace.

May your precious blood be our defence
and salvation.

By your grace, may you turn the evil of this disease
into moments of consolation and hope.

May we always fear the contagion of sin
more than any illness.

We abandon ourselves to your
infinite mercy. Amen.
